Congregational Missions

Persons of all ages at Mt. Auburn's Stones Crossing and Trafalgar Campus enjoy supporting missions. The Mt. Auburn family has supplied over 2,800 bags or 2.8 tons of food for students in need at ISOM and Northeast Elementary through our Adopt-a-School food drive. Along with regular food drives, we sponsor a recurring luggage drive to support children who have been removed from their homes due to neglect or abuse. These items help children in child protection services foster care through our local department of children services offices.

Mt. Auburn also provides students and adults with ways to serve their community through serve days and mission trips. Our 2021 Trafalgar Serve Day is April 17 and our 2021 Stones Crossing Serve Day is May 1. Our middle school students also helped our community through a local service projects in March. In 2021, our high school students have the opportunity to go on two mission trips this year. One to McAllen, Texas to help out a Christian school in a largely Hispanic community. The other in Memphis, Tennessee to assist Street Reach Ministries.

Mt. Auburn ensures our congregation is cared for through Parish Care programs like Loving Stitches, Caring Card Ministry and more. Our goal is to let the congregation know they are loved and cared for, as well as reaching out to those that have not yet accepted Christ into their heart.

Kuandaa International



Through Kuandaa International, Mt. Auburn helps to support the mission work of Dr. Jim Hertel. Dr. Hertel served as Mt. Auburn's senior pastor for 25 years, retiring in 2014.

After retiring, Dr. Hertel continued the mission work he began in Africa while serving as Mt. Auburn's pastor. Mt. Auburn supports Dr. Hertel's vision for Village Church Planting throughout Uganda. Through Dr. Hertel's leadership, and his partnership with Ugandan pastors, thousands have come to the know Christ as Savior, as churches have been planted throughout Uganda.

Dr. Hertel has broadened his focus on village church planting to include having wells dug at the sites of the church plants. This strategy provides an opportunity for people to hear of the living water offered through Jesus Christ as they pump clean water. Children's activity books that teach children how to pray are also distributed. This ministry was initiated and developed by Dale Bronson and Gene Bertolet. At least 30,000 books have been distributed.

In January 2020, Paul Sanders teamed up with Foundations of Hope in Carmel to install four solar-powered water purifier systems at a school, orphanage, and two churches. Three new water wells were also being dug and were dedicated in February when Dr. Hertel returned to Uganda. Ten thousand more children activity books were printed and distributed. Dr. Hertel and team are strategizing their first post-COVID trip to Africa. Mt. Auburn supports these ministry efforts, both through financial support and mission teams.

Mt. Auburn Meal Ministry (MAMM) began in 2016 as the fruition of an idea developed by Latheda Noonan, Wendy Sanders, and the Jacobson Life Group. MAMM provides dinner and prayer on Thursday nights (except the third Thursday) at Mt. Auburn to those in need throughout the local community. Many congregation members support MAMM by volunteering with food preparation, serving, prayer ministry, and clean-up. They continued to serve drive-thru meals throughout the pandemic. From January - March in-person: 358 people served; March - December drive-thru: 2,039 meals served; 37 meal nights scheduled in 2021. Mamm offers "Upper Room" devotionals twice a month, communion is offered once a month and prayer is offered every time.

World Vision world vision



World Vision is the largest non-governmental provider of clean water in the world. Last year World Vision reached over 4.6 million new people with clean water. World Vision aspires to be like Jesus, so they serve all people, regardless of their religion, ethnicity or gender.

Mount Auburn Team World Vision, a team of several persons from and related to Mt. Auburn and coordinated by Gretchen Beaman, was formed in 2017 to run/walk as a World Vision team to raise awareness and funding for clean water, improved sanitation, and hygiene to those in need around the globe. In 2019, this team trained for and participated in the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon/Half-Marathon race, raising close to \$15,000. In 2020 they participated in the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon/Half-Marathon race on November 7, 2020, raising money, in order to continue to help provide clean water internationally. Mt. Auburn teams, including the 30-Hour Famine and VBS children, have raised \$105,400 between 2007-2019. In 2020, the team raised \$19,661.
